Dear Mr. Axelson:

On July 15, 2010, the Loyd Farm 1-32 water evaporation pit was sampled for closure. A composite sample of four areas was taken 6" below surface from the bottom of the evaporation pit. The samples were sent to Origins Laboratory in Denver CO. and tested for BTEX, TPH, SAR, PH and EC as per request from the COGCC.

Based on lab sample results, Noble Energy, Inc. completed the process of backfilling the water evaporation pit July 27, 2010. Cow manure was also spread and mixed into the top soil and seeding operations will begin this fall using a local grass seed mixture.

The attached documentation includes a completed Form 27, laboratory analytical results from confirmation soil samples, and site diagram. Based on the site remedial activities and the attached laboratory analytical results, Noble Energy, Inc. is requesting that the COGCC consider this location remediated, requiring no further action.
