As noted in our July 9, 2012 email to Citation, the Form 19 for the spill at this location must to be resubmitted with the corrected incident date (May 31, 2011 -- not May 31, 2012). Additionally, Section 906 a. (5) specifies that an 8 1/2 x 11 inch topographic map showing the governmental section and location of the spill shall be included with all spill reports. Submit the revised Form 19 and map by August 20, 2012. Submit directly to me via email at annie.eckman@state.co.us, by mail to the address below, or via fax at (303) 894-2109 to the attn of A. Eckman.

Note that the 15 cubic yards of impacted soil may not be used to build up containment dikes at the production facility as requested in your March 30, 2012 letter. The soils can either be properly disposed of at an authorized facility (with copies of the waste manifests subsequently submitted to COGCC), or treated on site (and could then be put to beneficial reuse as containment dike material). If this option is selected, approval of the treatment plan by COGCC would be required prior to treatment, and post-treatment confirmation sampling would be required before reuse.
