On March 22, 2000, Tyler Rockies Exploration, Ltd. ("Tyler") submitted to the Commission an application pursuant to Rule 325, for a permit to dispose of produced water into the Cowell No. 1 Well located in the NE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 31, Township 3 South, Range 59 West.

On March 30, 2000, Ronald D. Funk submitted a protest to the application filed by Tyler.

On May 22, 2000, Tyler, by its attorney, filed with the Commission a verified application for an order authorizing the disposal of produced water into the Cowell No. 1 Well located in the NE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 31, Township 3 South, Range 59 West. Tyler proposes that the produced water will be injected into the "J" Sand Formation at a depth of 6239 feet to 6270 feet.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has scheduled the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

Any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application or to intervene should file with the Commission a written protest or a notice to intervene no later than June 23, 2000 briefly stating the basis of the protest or intervention. Such interested party shall, at the same time, serve a copy of the protest or notice to intervene to the person filing the application. An original and nine (9) copies shall be filed with the Commission.
