On January 19, 1978, Pepper Tank Company filed an application pursuant to Rule 329 of the Rules and Regulations for approval to use Well No. 7 Gillette, located in the NW1/4SW1/4 Section 4, Township 9 North, Range 61 West, 6th P.M., Keota Field, Weld County, Colorado, as a water disposal well. A protest to the granting of the application was filed on January 27, 1978 by Charles A. Underwood.
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, on its own motion, has set the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

At said hearing, applicant and protestant and any other interested persons are requested to appear and present testimony in order for the Commission to determine if approval for said water disposal well should be given.
Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.
