County of Denver; that said The
Daily Journal is printed and pub-
lished daily except Sundays, Mon-
days and legal holidays; that said
The Daily Journal is a daily news-
paper within the meaning of the act
of the General Assembly of the State
of Colorado, approved April 7, 1921
and entitled "An Act Concerning
Legal Notices, Advertisements and
Publications, and the Fees of Print-
ers and Publishers Thereof, and to
Repeal All Acts and Parts of Acts
in Conflict with the Provisions of
This Act" and as amended by
an act of said General Assembly,
entitled, "An Act to Amend An
Act Entitled "An Act Concerning
Legal Notices, Advertisements and
Publications and the Fees of Print-
ers and Publishers Thereof and to
Repeal All Acts and Parts of Acts in
