2. That the said Adams County Sentinel is printed and published at regular intervals, one time each week on Thursday and that it has a general circulation in the County of Adams and elsewhere.

3. That the said Adams County Sentinel was established and has been printed and published in said county uninterruptedly and continuously during a period of at least fifty-two consecutive weeks next prior to the first issue thereof containing said publication, a copy of which is hereunto attached.

4. That the said Adams County Sentinel is a weekly newspaper of general circulation, and is printed and published in whole or in part in the said County of Adams in which said publication is required by law to be published, a copy of which is hereunto attached.

The Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, on the application of Bill Tomberlin, has called a hearing to consider the promulgation of field rules to govern the location of wells in the "J" Sand Pool of the Little Beaver Field area, in Washington and Adams counties, Colorado, so as to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in said field.

All operators and owners of working interests or minerals and all persons interested in said field are hereby notified by the State of Colorado, as represented by the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, that the above entitled matter has been set for hearing before the commission on:

DATE: Tuesday, Sept. 8, 1953
TIME: 10:00 A.M.

Place: Room 704, State Capitol Annex, Sherman Street and 14th Avenue, Denver, Colorado.

Pursuant to said hearing in the above entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of said field, with particular reference to rules regulating spacing of wells and practices relating to the drilling and completion of said wells in said field.
