IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN OPERATIONS IN THE BONHAM FIELD, LOGAN COUNTY, COLORADO.

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, on its own motion, has set the above entitled matter for hearing on:

TIME: 10 a. m.

PLACE: Conference Room 260, Columbine Building, 1845 Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado

On November 3, 1953, the Commission issued its Order No. 24-1, subsequently amended by Order No. 24-2, which, among other things, established 40-acre drilling and spacing units for production of oil and gas from the "J" sand formation underlying the Bonham Field.

Due to the present status of depletion of said Bonham Field, the Commission has instituted this proceeding to consider the vacating of said orders in this cause, and substituting in lieu thereof the provisions of the general rules and regulations of this Commission.

Any operators and owners of working interests, and any person interested in said Bonham Field, is hereby requested to appear at the above-scheduled hearing and show cause, if any they have, why the Commission should not vacate the orders previously issued by the Commission in Cause No. 24, Bonham Field.

Pursuant to said hearing in the above entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of the Bonham Field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.
