AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On June 5, 1979, Amoco Production Company, filed with the Commission an application for an order establishing 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of gas from the "J" Sand, common source of supply underlying the following described lands in Adams County, Colorado, to-wit:

Township 2 South, Range 63 West,
6th P.M.

Section 25: All Section 34: E 1/4
Section 26: All Section 35: All
Section 27: E 1/4 Section 36: All

and further providing that the units consist of the N 1/4 and S 1/4 or the E 1/4 and W 1/4 of a quarter section, according to the governmental survey thereof, with the permitted well located in the center of the NE 1/4 and SW 1/4 of a quarter section with a tolerance of 150 feet; however, any well drilled or being drilled, or a well location already approved for production of gas from the "J" Sand and not in conformance with the permitted well locations, should be considered an exception and be the permitted well for the unit upon which it is located.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has set the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

TIME: 9:00 a.m.

PLACE: Room 110, State Centennial Building, 1313 Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado 80203

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

Any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application should file with the Commission a written protest no later than July 11, 1979, briefly stating the basis of the protest, and such interested party shall at the same time serve or mail a copy of the protest to the person filing the application.
