## NOTICE OF HEARING

BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO

IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN OPERATIONS IN THE KATIE FIELD, ADAMS COUNTY, COLORADO

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On September 12, 1979, Sandlin Oil Corporation and Gary Sandlin, by their attorney, filed with the Commission an application for an order establishing 160-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of gas from the "J" Sand and any other gas formation below said "J" Sand and above the Morrison formation, which constitutes a common source of supply underlying the following described lands in the Katie Field, Adams County, Colorado, to-wit:

Township 2 South, Range 63 West, 6th P.M.  
Section 27: W $\frac{1}{2}$  Section 34: W $\frac{1}{2}$

Section 33: All Township 3 South, Range 63 West, 6th P.M.

Section 3: All Section 9: All  
Section 4: All Section 10: W $\frac{1}{2}$ , E $\frac{1}{2}$

and further providing that the units consist of 160-acres and consist of a quarter section, according to the governmental survey thereof, and the permitted well be located no closer than 800 feet from the boundaries of the unit and no closer than 2100 feet from another produceable or drilling gas well in the same common source of supply. In addition, the well located in the C SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 34, Township 2 South, Range 63 West, 6th P.M., should be considered the permitted well for the unit upon which it is located.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has set the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

Any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application should file with the Commission a written protest no later than October 10, 1979, briefly stating the basis of the protest, and such interested party shall, at the same time, serve or mail a copy of the protest to the person filing the application.
