NOTICE OF HEARING BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO CAUSE NO. 304

AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On February 17, 1976, the Commission issued its Order No. 304-1 which established 320-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of gas from the Sussex formation underlying certain lands in the Hambert Field.

The spaced area was extended by Order No. 304-3, issued December 20, 1976. In addition it was further ordered that a hearing shall be held on the August 1977 hearing date, at which time the Commission shall review data obtained from additional development in the spaced area in order to determine whether the spacing as established by Order No. 304-1, and subsequent Order No. 304-3 should be continued.

The lands included in the spaced area of the Hambert Field, Adams County, Colorado are described as follows:
