IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN OPERATIONS IN THE CODELL FORMATION, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO

TO ALL PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On December 20, 1983, the Commission issued Order No. 407-1 which, among other things, established 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil and/or gas from the Codell formation underlying certain lands in Adams, Boulder, Jefferson, Larimer and Weld Counties, Colorado. The units consist of the E 1/4 and W 1/4 or the N 1/4 and S 1/4 of a governmental quarter section. The S 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, Township 6 North, Range 68 West, 6th P.M., has been designated a drilling and spacing unit.

On February 2, 1984, Sunset Hill Oil Co., Inc., by its attorneys, filed with the Commission an application for an order pooling all interests in the unit consisting of the S 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, Township 6 North, Range 68 West, 6th P.M., Larimer County, Colorado, for the development and operation of the Codell formation for production of oil and/or gas underlying said unit, pursuant to 34-60-116, C.R.S. 1973, as amended.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has scheduled the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

DATE: Monday, March 19, 1984

TIME: 9:00 a.m.

PLACE: Room 110, State Centennial Building, 1313 Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado 80203

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operations of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

Any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application should file with the Commission a written protest no later than March 14, 1984, briefly stating the basis of the protest, and such interested party shall, at the same time, serve or mail a copy of the protest to the person filing the application.
