NOTICE OF HEARING BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO CAUSE NO. 407

IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN OPERATIONS IN THE CODELL FORMATION IN ADAMS, BOULDER, JEFFERSON, LARIMER AND WELD COUNTIES, COLORADO TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On December 19, 1983, the Commission issued Order No. 407-1 which, among other things, established 80-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of oil and/or gas from the Codell formation underlying certain lands in Adams, Boulder, Jefferson, Larimer and Weld Counties, Colorado. The units consist of the E 1/2 and W 1/2 of the N 1/2 and S 1/2 of a governmental quarter section with the permitted well located in the center of the quarter-quarter section with a tolerance of 200 feet with the option to drill an additional well in the undrilled 40-acre tract.

On April 6, 1984, Skaer Enterprises, Inc., by its attorney, filed with the Commission an application for an order deleting the following described lands in Larimer and Weld Counties, Colorado from the provisions of Order No. 407-1 and make said lands subject to the general rules and regulations of the Commission.
