On December 31, 1958, James R. Jennings filed with the Commission an application for an exception to Order No. 48-1, subsequently amended as to field limits, for a well to be drilled on the following described location in Logan County, Colorado:

Center of the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 4, Township 7 North, Range 55 West of the 6th P.M., being 1560 feet east of the west line, and 960 feet north of the south line.

and approval of said location or locations and the drilling thereof of Applicants proposed well or wells on the acreage herein described, so long as said location or locations shall consist of one well per quarter-section, and further that in no event shall any location fall closer than 600 feet from the outside boundary of the leasehold.
