NOTICE OF HEARING
TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On July 14, 1954, the Commission issued Order No. 34-1 which among other things, established 640-acre drilling and spacing units for the production of gas from the Topeka-Lansing formation underlying lands in the Greenwood Field, with the permitted well located within 500 feet of the center of the unit. By subsequent orders certain lands were added and deleted from the spaced area.

On June 8, 1979, Ewin L. Cox, by his attorney, filed with the Commission an application for an order granting an exception to the spacing pattern established for the Greenwood Field, for a well, No. 1 Brandt-O'Neil, which has been drilled at a location 1470 feet from the west line and 1470 feet from the south line, Section 16, Township 34 South, Range 41 West, 6th P. M. and that said well be allowed to produce gas from the Topeka-Lansing formation.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has set the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

DATE: Monday, July 16, 1979.

TIME: 9:00 a. m.

PLACE: Room 110, State Centennial Building, 1313 Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado 80203.

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter, at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operation of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

Any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application should file with the Commission a written protest no later than July 11, 1979, briefly stating the basis of the protest, and such interested party shall at the same time serve or mail a copy of the protest to the person filing the application.
