The Commission issued its Order No. 44-1 on September 28, 1954, which order was subsequently amended as to area. Said Order No. 44-1, in part, established 40-acre drilling units for production of oil and gas from the "J" sand formation underlying the Big Beaver Field. On June 7, 1962, the Pan American Petroleum Corporation filed with the Commission an application for an order granting an exception to the spacing pattern established by said Order No. 44-1, for a well to be drilled in the "J" sand formation at a location 150 feet west of the center of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of

Section 16, Township 3 South, Range 56 West of the 6th P.M., in the Big Beaver Field, Washington County, Colorado.
