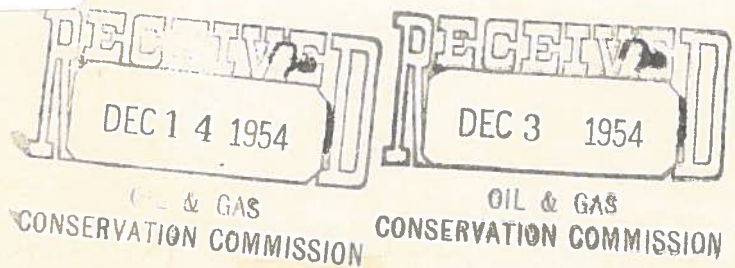

## NOTICE OF HEARING

BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO

IN THE MATTER OF THE INVESTIGATION TO TAKE MEASURES TO PREVENT WASTE OF OIL AND GAS IN THE "D" AND "J" SANDS OF THE LITTLE BEAVER FIELD IN WASHINGTON AND ADAMS COUNTIES, COLORADO

CAUSE No. 30- NOTICE OF HEARING TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, has set the above-entitled matter down for hearing on:

DATE: Wednesday, December 15, 1954

TIME: 10:00 A. M. PLACE: 330 State Office Building, Colfax Avenue and Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado.

The Commission has heretofore issued its Order No. 30-5, which provides in part that the operators and owners of wells producing from the "D" sand shall not produce gas from any one well in an amount, during any one month, exceeding a daily average of One Hundred Thousand (100,000) cubic feet; and that the operators and owners of wells producing from the "J" sand shall not produce gas from any one well in an amount, during any one month, exceeding a daily average of One Hundred Fifty Thousand (150,000) cubic feet.

All operators and owners of working interest, and all persons interested in said field, are hereby required to appear at the hearing as set forth above, and to show cause, if any they have, why the Commission should not enter a gas-oil-ratio Order restricting the production of both oil and gas.
