1. That he is the Editor of The Adams County Sentinel, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Brighton, County of Adams, and State of Colorado, and has personal knowledge of all the facts set forth in this affidavit.

2. That the said Adams County Sentinel is printed and published at regular intervals, one time each week on Thursday and that it has a general circulation in the County of Adams and elsewhere.

3. That the said Adams County Sentinel was established and has been printed and published in said county uninterruptedly and continuously during a period of at least fifty-two consecutive weeks next prior to the first issue thereof containing said publication, a copy of which is hereunto attached.

4. That the said Adams County Sentinel is a weekly newspaper of general circulation, and is printed and published in whole or in part in the said County of Adams in which said publication is required by law to be published, a copy of which is hereunto attached.

NOTICE OF HEARING TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado has set the above-entitled matter down for hearing on:  
DATE: Wednesday, December 15, 1954  
TIME: 10:00 A. M.  
PLACE: 330 State Office Building  
Colfax Avenue and Sherman Street  
Denver, Colorado.  
The Commission has heretofore issued its Order No. 30-5, which provides in part that the operators and owners of wells producing from the "D" sand shall not produce gas from any one well in an amount, during any one month, exceeding a daily average of One Hundred Thousand (100,000) cubic feet; and that the operators and owners of wells producing from the "J" sand shall not produce gas from any one well in an amount, during any one month, exceeding a daily average of One Hundred-Fifty Thousand (150,000) cubic feet.  
All operators and owners of working interest, and all persons interested in said field, are hereby required to appear at the hearing as set forth above, and to show cause, if any they have, why the Commission should not enter a gas-oil ratio Order restricting the production of both oil and gas.
