NOTICE OF HEARING
BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS
CONSERVATION COMMISSION

INVESTIGATION TO
TAKE MEASURES TO
PREVENT WASTE OF
OIL AND GAS IN THE
"J" SAND OF THE LIT-
TLE BEAVER FIELD,
WASHINGTON AND AD-
JAMS COUNTIES, COLO-
RADO.

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS
AND TO WHOM IT MAY CON-
CERN:

On September 26, 1955, the Com-
mission issued its Order No. 30-8
Rule 1 of which was subsequently
revised by Order No. 30-13, and, in
part, reads as follows:

"...and the maximum
production of gas from any
one (1) well producing gas
only, or producing oil and gas
with a gas-oil ratio in excess
of Thirty Thousand (30,000)
cubic feet of gas to one (1)
barrel of oil from the "J"
Sand pool shall not exceed a
daily average of Two Hun-
dred Thousand (200,000) cu-
bic feet of gas; and the allow-
able gas production may be
exceeded during the effective
period of this order by not in
excess of six (6) days' allow-
able gas production; provided,
however, that any such over-
production or underproduc-
tion shall be produced in ac-
cordance with Commission re-
quirements."

On August 27, 1963, Plains Ex-
ploration Company filed with the
Commission an application for an
order amending portions of said
Rule 1 of Order No. 30-8, as re-
vised in Order No. 30-13, so as to
permit production of larger quan-
tities of gas during given periods,
but in no event to allow the total
gas production in a twelve-month
period to exceed 200,000 cubic feet
of gas per day.
