On November 15, 1954, the Gem Oil Company, et al filed with the Commission an application for an order to delete from the Adena South Field and add to the Adena Field Sections Twenty-five (25), Twenty-six (26), Twenty-seven (27), and Twenty-eight (28), Township One (1) North, Range Fifty-eight (58) West of the 6th P.M., and the South Half (S/2) of Section Thirty (30), Township One (1) North, Range Fifty-seven (57) West of the 6th P.M., all in Morgan County, Colorado.

In connection with Cause No. 33, applicants request an order to amend the spacing rules in Order No. 33-1, and to amend the oil allowable as provided in Order No. 33-5, all in Adena South Field.
