Provide a detailed description of the incident, problem and cause (equipment failure, human error, etc.): An observation was made on the date of 10-3-13 of what appears to be a spill from a well resulting from flood trauma to structures on the site. The spill looked to be leaking into a nearby lake as of the observation date, and appeared to have been partially buried by approximately 250' x 250' of dirt or earth of some kind. The apparent dark petrochemical liquid leakage also looks to have continued to leak into the nearby lake despite having been covered in soil. The concern is that the cover is a mitigation procedure being implemented to obscure from the public what may be an ongoing leak, rather than a solution to the possible ongoing spill of chemicals into the environment.
