2	Wildlife	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All garbage and any food items will be placed in bear proof trash containers. Personnel will not feed bears at any time. Bears will not be approached if encountered in the project area. • Seed mix used for interim and final reclamation is prescribed by the landowner. • Other considerations as described in the Wildlife Mitigation Plan with Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife.
3	Storm Water/Erosion Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Run-on protection and run-off controls will be installed prior to the beginning of construction activities, as practicable, with consideration given to worker safety and site access. 4	Construction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stockpiles for topsoil, excess cut material, and drill cuttings will be located in work areas within perimeter BMPs. • Stormwater BMPs will be installed per details in the Stormwater BMP manual. • Disturbed area of site will be left in a surface roughened condition when feasible. • BMPs will be protected, inspected and repaired as necessary. • Dust mitigation practices will be utilized.
