A water truck driver was pulling a load of produced water from a production tank on the pad. When he finished, he did not have the valve on the truck tank completely closed. When he disconnected from the load out bowl produced water flowed out of the open ended hose. The water pooled around the containment structure and then migrated down the access road approximately 200 feet.		

CORRECTIVE ACTION



Describe immediate response (how stopped, contained and recovered): <u>The driver immediately closed the partially open valve. The entire release was contained to a small area near the containment structure and access road. Due to the dry soil conditions none of the fluids lost were recovered as they soaked into the soil.</u>
Describe any emergency pits constructed: <u>None were constructed.</u>
How was the extent of contamination determined? <u>By field measurements and mapping with a Trimble GPS unit.</u>
Further remediation activities proposed (attach separate sheet if needed): <u>The impacted area will be treated in place. Soil sample will be collected for compliance with COGCC Table 910-1 standards. Further remedial actions will be based on these results.</u>
Describe measures taken to prevent problem from reoccurring: <u>The driver responsible for the release was reprimanded and will be re-trained on company protocol in regards to checking valves and connections while conducting fluid transfers. The driver will also be required to attend WPX in-house training for spill prevention, response, and reporting in the near future.</u>
