Dear Mr. Lepore:

Kerr-McGee Oil & Gas Onshore LP (“KMG”) respectfully requests the Director approve an exception to Rule 318A.a to allow the above-named wells to be drilled at the above-referenced location. Rule 318A.a of the Colorado Oil and Gas Commission’s Rules and Regulations requires wells to be drilled and completed in a square with sides four hundred (400) feet in length, the center of which is the center of any quarter/quarter section or in the center of any quarter section with the four sides being eight hundred (800) feet in length. The above-named wells are being permitted is an exception location at the request of the surface owner.

Under the Revised Rule 318A.c of the Colorado Oil and Gas Commission’s Rules and Regulations, it requires any new twinning well to be located within fifty (50) feet of an existing well. The above-named wells are more than 50 feet from the nearest oil and gas well.
