



**APPROVAL OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR TO CONSTRUCT AND
OPERATE THE HARRISON CREEK PRODUCED WATER RECYCLING FACILITY,
UNDER WASTE RELATED USE / RECYCLING COLLECTION
LOCATED AT 69861 E. HIGHWAY 330, COLLBRAN**

WHEREAS, Doug Dennison, of Cordilleran, on behalf of the property owner, Delta Petroleum Corporation, requested approval for a Conditional Use Permit to construct and operate a new facility, the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility, for recycling water produced from natural gas exploration and production processes in the Agricultural, Forestry, Transitional (AFT) zone located as shown on attached Exhibit "A" and more particularly described on attached Exhibit "B", Legal Description and

WHEREAS, the attached Exhibit "C" is the site plan for the proposed use, and

WHEREAS, the staff recommendation was contained in a staff report dated, April 13, 2009, and

WHEREAS, the Mesa County Planning Commission recommended approval with conditions at their April 23, 2009, public hearing, and

WHEREAS, the public hearing before the Mesa County Board of County Commissioners was held on May 12, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF MESA FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

THAT public notice requirements of Section 3.1.8 of the Mesa County Land Development Code (2000, as amended) have been met.

THAT the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility located at 69861 E. Hwy. 330 in Collbran can meet (with compliance with conditions) the applicable Approval Criteria for a Conditional Use Permit (Section 3.8.7), the General Approval Criteria (Section 3.1.17) of the Mesa County Land Development Code (2000, as amended) including consistency with intergovernmental agreements.

THAT this request for a Conditional Use Permit to construct and operate the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility for recycling water produced from natural gas exploration and production processes is in accordance with the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Mesa County.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN THE COUNTY OF MESA, STATE OF COLORADO:

THAT the request for a Conditional Use Permit is approved with the following conditions:

1. All review agency comments shall be addressed, including those from the Mesa County Development Engineer, the Mesa County Health Department, Mesa County Pest Management, and Mesa County Transportation Planning. Documentation of the responses must be provided to the Mesa County Planning and Economic Development Department.
2. The applicant, the property owner and operator of the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility shall obtain prior to operation, and continuously comply with all applicable local, state and federal permits required for the construction and operation of the facility, including but not limited to stormwater management permits, any applicable air and water quality permits, discharge permits, centralized waste management permits, and building permits from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE), the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC), and Mesa County. It shall be the obligation of the property owner and/or the operator to demonstrate to Mesa County's satisfaction compliance with applicable permits, requirements, regulations and laws.
3. All waste products shall be properly disposed of in licensed facilities. Wildlife proof solid waste receptacles shall be used at the site.
4. Noise levels from the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling facility shall comply with the standards established by the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC). A noise analysis for the recycling facility shall be submitted to the Mesa County Department of Planning and Development within four (4) months after the facility becomes operational.
5. The applicant, the property owner, and operator shall not deviate from the site plans and documents submitted for this Conditional Use Permit approved by Mesa County for the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility. Minor changes in the site plan may be approved by the Planning Director as long as the design intent is not altered.
6. The applicant shall submit a site plan application so that final construction plans and supporting engineering documentation and reports can be approved by the Planning Department prior to commencement of construction.
7. The private access road to the recycling facility shall be maintained by the applicant, the property owner, and/or the operator in an all-weather condition to facilitate emergency response and shall be treated with a dust suppressant to remain dust-free. Delta Petroleum Corporation is required to continue participating, along with the other gas and oil operators, in the annual Mag-Chloride applications for County Highway 330 East at a percentage determined by a joint decision of the Mesa County Road and Bridge Department and participating operators as long as this facility is operational. In addition, Delta Petroleum Corporation is required to enter into an agreement with Mesa County Road and Bridge Department to address specific comments related to roadbase maintenance (dated 02/19/09).
8. A list of all equipment with installation costs for all facilities associated with this project shall be provided to the Mesa County Assessor's Office.
9. Landowners and operators of the Harrison Creek Produced Water Recycling Facility shall continuously control noxious weeds as defined by Mesa County and the State of Colorado. Prior

to excavation, the site shall be scouted and noxious weeds identified. Said weeds shall not be allowed to become established, go to seed, or spread to other properties. When a noxious weed is suspected or has been identified to exist on the property, the operators and/or landowners shall contact the Mesa County Division of Pest Management for information on how to effectively treat the noxious weeds.

HARRISON CREEK PRODUCED WATER RECYCLING FACILITY





