Jerry,

This is a follow up to my voice message. Regarding the oily waste generated from the recent spill, if you are hauling that material to another location for storage - stop. Please see your options under Rule 907.e. I've attached the 900 Series rules for your reference.

You can either take the material to a commercial disposal facility, a permitted Centralized Waste Management Facility or treat on site under an approved Form 27. Hauling the material off to another location that is not one allowed by rule is a violation.

In the meantime, stockpile the oily waste on site and install stormwater controls. Please reply to me with the total volume of oily waste that has been generated to date.

Regarding the flowline release, all oily waste surrounding the line will need to be removed and confirmation samples collected to verify cleanup in accordance with 910-1 standards. Samples will need to be collected from below the flowline and the sidewalls to demonstrate cleanup both vertically and laterally.
