Jim,

As a courtesy Red Willow is reporting a spill to the COGCC.

Red Willow had a 4.3 bbl produced water spill Wednesday July 6 at the Soute Fc 33-9 #22-8. The compressor station that receives gas from this well went down at 10pm on 7/5/2016 causing high line pressure. This in turn caused the Soute Fc 33-9 #22-8 well to build pressure causing produced to leak out of the wellhead packing. An estimated 4.3 bbl of produced water spilled onto the ground around the wellhead. The Lease Operator tightened the packing when he arrived to stop the leak. No produced water left the location. Attached are the spill report form , a spill map, and photographs.

Red Willow proposes no further action on this spill because it is a Fruitland coal produced water spill and the produced water did not leave location. Fruitland coal produced water has low TDS and salts and a neutral pH.
