Gentlemen:

On April 9, 1959, we wrote Mr. Conley Cox regarding disposition of some wells, and requested forms on some of the operations. No answer has been received to this letter.

I am writing a duplicate letter to Mr. Cox, covering operations in the Red Mesa area which I visited last week, since there has been a change of name on some of the wells from Conley Cox to the Honolulu Exploration & Drilling Corp.

Listed below are the wells as identified on our township plate, with a statement of requirements of this office for each well:

1. Conley Cox No. 1 Webber - NW NE, Sec. 13

Last information was intention to drill  
approved October 27, 1958.

Required: Disposition as to drilling. If  
not drilling, approval is voided.

2. Conley Cox No. 4-A Kroeger - SW SW, Sec. 16

Intention to drill approved February 20, 1959

Require: Possibility of future drilling. In-  
tention will be voided August 20, 1960

Intention to drill approved February 20, 1959.

Require: Possibility of future drilling. In-  
tention will be voided August 20, 1959.

6. Kroeger No. 1-B - SE SE, Sec. 35

Intention to drill approved February 20, 1959.

Require: Possibility of future drilling. In-  
tention will be voided August 20, 1959.

In addition to the above, please be advised that no production re-  
port has been received for May or June on the Kroeger and Kennedy leases,  
both of which reports are past due.

Your immediate attention is called to the above matters, and if no  
answer is received by August 12, 1959, we will take such action as may be  
deemed appropriate.
