Dear Mr. Neslin:

We heard you on the radio stating that the COGCC would test water subject to contamination through fracking activities. We have a fracking operation starting up four-tenths of a mile west of us. Since the aquifer runs towards us, we are requesting that COGCC perform pre and post water tests (mining package) to ensure that our well is not contaminated. Our property is at: 1/2S 1/4SW S15 T9N R67.

Second, we would like the name and telephone numbers of the company and the contact person for this operation; we know Rubicon sold, but are not sure to whom.

Finally, as stated previously, we do hold the COGCC responsible for enforcing agricultural noise standards as outlined in your rules and regulations. We do have pregnant cows and feeders that will be adversely affected. This is our business and we have a right to maintain this business and a right to recover damages. As you might remember, our feeders lost 50 pounds each during Rubicon's activities last year. We have a on-site scale and will weigh these animals previous to the startup of these operations; you are invited to observe our weighing of these animals.
