Pursuant to recent phone calls with Ms. Johnson, this letter is merely a follow-up setting forth the details of the damage situation.

The site needs to be repaired immediately. It has been sitting in an unrestored condition for quite some time. The Cattlemen's Association that uses the area will soon be moving in their cattle for pasture. The fence has been knocked down by the elk, and the tourists will soon be using the forest.


Our forester, Mr. Chuck Janov, can have the site restored immediately, with the exception of removal of the deadmen and disturbance of the pipe. It is my understanding that the well has not been properly plugged and abandoned at this time, which is why the deadmen and pipe will be undisturbed.

The complete restoration, i.e., filling the pits, grading, removal of the trash, road repair and reseedling, can be done for \$2,000 provided we receive the money as soon as possible. This is because there is a contractor in the immediate vicinity who can and will do the work.


You will, of course, be required to properly plug and abandon the well. If no further damages occur during this process, your bond will be canceled and we will recommend that Jackson County also cancel their bond.
