The Kielian 2-2 battery is surrounded by private ranching and agricultural mixed-use properties in all directions. There are residential properties ~400' west and ~300' southeast. The wellhead is located ~250' northwest of the battery. A small pond is in place ~60' west of the battery and a gravel pit is in place ~600' east. The Thompson and Platte Ditch is in place ~1,180' south of the battery. There is 1 groundwater well mapped within a ¼ mile of the battery. Groundwater depth is unknown but is expected to be encountered at <20' bgs. The 100-year floodplain of the Big Thompson River drainage is mapped ~260' north of the battery. The battery is located within a Mule Deer Severe Winter Range Buffer and an Aquatic Native Species Conservation Waters buffer is mapped ~1,050' northwest of the battery.

INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Great Western proposes to conduct closure of the Kielian 2-2 oil and gas facility. There is one partially buried produced water tank associated with the facility. Tank battery closure activities are planned to commence on 4/30/2021 and be completed by 6/18/2021. Great Western will conduct site investigation activities, field screening, and confirmation soil sampling activities during closure in accordance with COGCC 900 Series Rules. Discrete soil samples will be collected and analyzed pursuant to Rule 915, following the general sample collection guidance in Rule 915.e.(2). All waste generated during the closure activities will be managed and disposed of at a licensed disposal facility in accordance with Rules 905 and 906. See the attached Figure 1 for an illustration of the location of the Site.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Approximately 14 discrete soil samples will be collected for field screening at the battery. At least 4 of the samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene and Gasoline Range Organics (GRO) [C6-C10] by EPA Method 8260 and for Diesel Range Organics (DRO) [C10-C28] and Residual Range Organics (RRO) [C28-C40] by EPA Method 8015. Analytical results for GRO, DRO, and RRO will be added together to calculate Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH). In addition, the soil sample from the base of the partially buried produced water vessel will be analyzed for the Soil Suitability for Reclamation parameters; Electrical Conductivity (EC), Sodium Absorption Ratio (SAR), and pH by Saturated Paste Method, and boron by Hot Water-Soluble Soil Extract Method. See the attached Figure 2 for an illustration of the Site layout and proposed discrete soil sample locations.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Up to two deeper test pits will be excavated to a depth of approximately 12 feet adjacent to the water tank and separator equipment. If groundwater is encountered within that test pits, or a pathway to groundwater is observed, groundwater samples will be collected in accordance with COGCC Rule 915.e.(3)., and will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene by EPA Method 8260.
