INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Pursuant to COGCC Rule 911 a site investigation will be conducted pertaining to the FUEGO C01-19 wellhead cut and cap and flowline removal. Approximately 710' of flowline will be removed, however a portion of the flowline will be abandoned-in-place due to field constraints. The COGCC will be updated in a supplemental Form 27. The wellhead will be cut and capped per COGCC rules. The Flowline Pre-Abandonment Notice Document number is included under Related Forms.

A grab soil sample will be collected at the base of the excavation or the area showing the highest degree of impact during field screening activities at the wellhead excavation. A grab confirmation soil sample will be collected at the wellhead excavation. Soil samples will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons) organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected will be analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved COGCC laboratory analysis methods.

Field personnel will field screen all disturbed areas using visual and olfactory senses to determine if laboratory confirmation sampling is required. The COGCC Flowline Closure and Wellhead Closure Checklists will be utilized and filled out during the abandonment process. A photolog will be submitted on the Subsequent Form 27.

OPERATOR COMMENT

Operator conducted a site investigation at the former Fuego C1-19 wellhead. During cut and cap sampling, a soil sample exceeded the Protection of Groundwater SSLs (PGW SSLs) for 1-methylnaphthalene, 2-methylnaphthalene, naphthalene and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene; however, these concentrations were less than the Residential SSLs. Soil and groundwater samples collected during the subsequent site investigation were less than the Table 915-1 PGW SSLs.

Operator will conduct quarterly groundwater sampling until 4 consecutive COGCC-compliant quarters are achieved. At that time, Operator will request a no further action determination.
