The COGCC Orphan Well Program will be plugging the Eisenhower 1-3 (OWP) well and decommissioning the associated flow lines and production equipment. Soil samples will be collected in accordance with COGCC Rule 915.e(2)B. A sufficient number of representative samples will be collected from locations beneath the pit to demonstrate that no leakage of managed fluids has occurred, per Rule 911.c(2). Any soil left in place will meet the cleanup concentrations listed in Table 915-1. Samples will be submitted for laboratory analysis of Table 915-1 constituents.
