Dear Mrs. Linvill:

This is in reply to your letter of April 8, wherein you ask for log of well drilled by Fred M. Manning, Inc., in November of 1949. Our records indicate that the well you refer to is Linvill No. 1, in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of 6-7N-53W.

The notice of intention to abandon well gives the following information:

"Well drilled to T.D. 5275' where Lakota was encountered, no shows after testing, well plugged and abandoned. Cement plugs set at 393' to 293' with 5 sacks poured at top of surface pipe and permanent well marker extending 4' above ground level set therein. Hole filled with heavy drilling mud from 5275' to 393' and from 293' to bottom of surface plug."
