INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

This form has been prepared to provide prior notice of the re-entry cut & cap of the UPRR 43 PAN AM C 1 wellhead. In accordance with ECMC Rule 911.a., Kerr-McGee's activities will include the collection and submittal of soil and groundwater (if present) samples for laboratory analysis to determine if concentrations and values are in compliance with ECMC Table 915-1. Visual inspection and field screening of soils around the wellhead will be conducted during sampling activities. The topographic Site Location Map showing the geographic setting of the site is provided as Figure 1. Kerr McGee will notify the Commission if impacts are confirmed through laboratory analysis so the Commission can determine how to address the impacts, since the operator of the UPRR 43 PAN AM C 1 well is no longer in existence.

Proposed Soil Sampling

Following wellhead cut and cap operations, soil will be field screened at the wellhead. Samples will be collected if indications of impacts to soil or groundwater are present. If impacted soils are encountered, a waste characterization soil sample will be collected from the areas exhibiting the highest degree of impact based on visual, olfactory, and/or field screening observations. In the absence of apparent impacts, a soil sample will be collected from the base of the excavation adjacent to the wellhead. Soil samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in ECMC Table 915-1. Proposed soil sample and screening locations are provided on Figure 2.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

If groundwater is encountered during facility decommissioning activities, a minimum of one grab sample will be collected as soon as practical. Groundwater samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene (1,2,4 – TMB), and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene (1,3,5 – TMB), using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in ECMC Table 915-1.
