Details of Plan of Work: (State names of and expected depths to objective sands; Show sizes, weights, and lengths of proposed casings; indicate mudding jobs, cementing points, and all other important proposed work.)

We propose to drill this well with rotary tools to a depth sufficient to test the "D" and "J" sands of the Dakota series. The approximate total depth will be 5,000 feet. We expect to reach the top of the "D" at approximately 4,700 feet, and the top of the "J" at 4,800 feet. We will set and cement sufficient surface casing to protect the hole and surface bearing water sands. In the event formations are encountered carrying oil or gas, or both, in commercial quantities, casing will be run and cemented to total depth.
