inspection by COGCC completed on 10/8/2022 identifying pit liner not maintained. Fluid level in the pit immediately reduced by operator and investigation completed internally. Once lowered, pit taken out of use and pit liner removed from pit on 10/12/2022 and properly disposed of. Soil sampling completed on 10/19/2022.

**PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN****Proposed Soil Sampling**

three in-situ samples from the pit will be taken, and one native sample from outside of the pit will be taken. These will be grab samples and analyzed for soil solubility for reclamation standards. Impacts from organic compounds are not as likely from coal bed methane "CBM" produced water. As such, analysis of some Table 915-1 Organic Compounds in Soils or other contaminants of concern may not be necessary to analyze for closure of CBM produced water Pits. Attached analytical results from the Lola 21-3 TR well demonstrate that the CBM produced water does not contain liquid hydrocarbons and we are requesting a reduction in the 915-1 constituents to match the Soil Suitability for Reclamation list of EC, SAR, pH and boron.
