On 2/29/2024 six (6) background samples were collected from 3 locations around the Peck TB. Analytical results from 10/25/2023 indicated elevated pH levels at 4 of 5 sample locations. Background sample results were below Table 915-1. See attached site investigation report for maps and the analytical report. Following discussion with the landowner, a reclamation plan will be submitted addressing the pH and included in the next Form 27 submittal (note: location is in cropland).
