Grab confirmation soil samples will be collected from the produced water vessel(s) excavation, beneath the ground oil tank(s), and at the separator(s). Additionally, soil samples will be collected at any points of material change and/or hammer unions, directional changes, as well as at the bell holes on either side of a waterway, where applicable. Soil samples will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons), organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected will be analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved COGCC laboratory analysis methods.

Field personnel will field screen all disturbed areas using visual and olfactory senses to determine if laboratory confirmation sampling is required. The COGCC Tank Battery and Produced Water Vessel Closure Checklists will be utilized and filled out during the abandonment process. A photolog will be submitted on the Subsequent Form 27.

It is anticipated that excavation will be used to remove soil impacts in the unsaturated zone. After excavation has been completed, groundwater monitoring wells will be reinstalled and a remedial action will be formulated as necessary.

Describe how remediation of existing impacts to soil and groundwater is to be accomplished (i.e. summarize remedial action plan). It is anticipated that excavation will be used to remove soil impacts in the unsaturated zone. After excavation has been completed, groundwater monitoring wells will be reinstalled and a remedial action will be formulated as necessary. The site was graded and topped with at least three feet of overburden following the installation of nine monitoring wells during Q1 2022. An attempt was made to locate and sample the wells during Q2 2022 to no avail. Currently the landowner has not granted us access to proceed with further groundwater remediation activities namely soil excavation and groundwater monitoring. The operator will continue to update the ECMC quarterly. Excavation will be scheduled promptly following an access approval from the landowner.

Nine monitoring wells have been installed. Monitoring wells have been covered by the landowner with four feet of fill. Attempts to locate the wells have been unsuccessful and the wells are presumed to be destroyed. If any of the wells are subsequently located it is anticipated that several of these will be destroyed during the excavation. Pending landowner access approval two additional monitoring wells will be installed south of the groundwater impacts to provide POC.
